AQUA Route 252 Water Main Replacement

At the Request of Upper Providence Township and Media Borough, Aqua Pennsylvania has changed their schedule, the week-day closure planned on Route 252 (Providence Road) has shifted to weeknights, from 7:00 PM to 5:00 AM, beginning Wednesday, May 8, through Friday, July 19, for utility installation.

Aqua Pennsylvania is planning to close Route 252 (Providence Road) weeknights between Kirk Lane and Monroe Street in Upper Providence Township and Media Borough, Delaware County, on Wednesday, May 8, through Friday, July 19, from 7:00 PM to 5:00 AM the following morning, for utility installation, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) today announced.

During the weeknight closure, Route 252 (Providence Road) motorists will be detoured over Kirk Lane, Orange Street and Baltimore Avenue.

Local access will be maintained up to the construction zone. Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling near this work area. The schedule is weather dependent.

SEWER AUTHORITY

Household “wipes” have become a major problem for sewer system operations and customers. Wipes of any kind should never be flushed into the sewer system. Even those that claim to be “flushable” or “septic system safe” do not deteriorate quickly and often result in clogged pipes and damaged pumps.

In addition, grease should not be washed down the drain. While it may seem to easily wash down the drain with hot water, it solidifies in underground pipes and contributes to clogs. Grease accumulation is also a problem for central pump stations and individual grinder pumps where its buildups cause significant removal and repair costs.

Storms and widespread power outages experienced recently severely affected our entire sewer system. Seven of our nine central pump stations which serve our gravity customers lost power. Using a combination of mobile generators and pump trucks, our contractor KBX Golden was able to prevent overflows at these stations. During such extreme weather situations it would be helpful for gravity customers to restrict their water usage to only essential use. For those with grinder pumps, it is essential that they limit water usage to an absolute minimum if they do not have a back up generator. When the power gets restored, it is likely that the grinder pump alarm will sound. This is because the water level in the tank is likely at a higher level than normal and it may take a few minutes for the grinder to pump the water level down. The alarm can be silenced by pushing the silence button on the bottom left side of the control box. The red light will remain lit. Once

the tank level has been restored to normal, the alarm will reset. If the pump has not reset within 30 minutes following a long outage, call the service company at the number listed on the blue sticker on the front of the control box. Also, please make sure the grinder pump circuit breaker in your house panel is on before calling.
